A highlight was seeing the rings of Saturn through Harry's (expert navigator) telescope. Trekking through the skies we found the constellations of Scorpios, Sagittarius

(The Tea Pot), Lupus (The Dog), Libra and the Southern Cross and the really bright stars - Antares, Spica, Arcturus, Vega, Archenar and Regulus.

Ruth Barbour and her husband Colin, were there to share in their knowledge and to present her book "Look at the Stars!" This book is ideal for newcomers, taking you on a light-hearted but informative journey introducing the wonders of the night skies.

Annie Powell, Grade 2 teacher at Cowan House, organized her class to share in "Appreciation of the Night Skies" and to learn about the Universe. The

playing field was the perfect venue and we even got to see the International Space Station fly over with six souls on board.
